This year, DOH-Duval aspires to make Jacksonville healthier by sharing important details on the Department's services, accomplishments, and eye-opening data.

- <u>Emergency Preparedness and Response</u>
  Plans and responds to the public health needs of the community during an emergency or disaster.
- Maternal Child Health

Serves as an advocate to improve the health status of the Jacksonville community through education, prevention, partnerships, and school health. Through its services, the division emphasizes growth, nutrition, development, and mental and physical health of mother and child from prenatal care to postpartum care.

- <u>Children's Health</u> Provides full medical care for children from birth to 18 years of age.
- Women's Health

Offers a variety of services for women, including well woman's care, family planning, and maternity services.

- <u>Environmental Health</u> Works to reduce emerging environmental health threats.
- Immunization

Provides vaccination services and keeps vaccination records.

## Epidemiology

Works to identify, investigate, manage, and evaluate health hazards in the community. Also provides information about communicable, reportable, and emerging disease and conditions.

- <u>STD/HIV Testing and Treatment</u> Offers comprehensive services and education for STDs and HIV.
- <u>Refugee and Immigration</u> Provides health services for people that are new to the United States.
