

2020 Duval County Overdose Data




- This report contains real-time prediagnostic data from the Electronic Surveillance System for the Early Notification of Community-based Epidemics (ESSENCE-FL).
 - 99% of Florida's emergency departments report to ESSENCE-FL.
- Data consists of chief complaints and discharge diagnoses for patients presenting to emergency departments (ED) in Duval County for drug overdose. Comparing data from 2019 to 2020 allows for identification of trends over a period of time.
 - This data is preliminary and subject to change.




- From 2019-2020, over 15,500 visits for drug overdoses in Duval County.
- From 2019-2020, the number of drug overdose ED visits in Duval County increased by 44%.




 In 2020, over 9,000 ED visits for drug overdose in Duval County. Nearly, 59% of the ED drug overdose visits resulted in opioid use.



In 2020, over 9,000 ED visits for drug overdose in Duval County; of these, 55% were males and 45% were females.



- In 2020, the number of drug overdose ED visits in Duval County by race displayed the white population as the highest race by 68%.
- Black and other races are made up 32% of drug overdose ED visits, respectively.



- In 2020, individuals age 35-54 visited the ED for drug overdose more frequently by 34%.
- Overall, males age 20-34 visited the ED more frequently for drug overdose by 18%
